## Sale of the Norman Cogger Mineral Collection

Norman lived in Tonbridge, Kent and was a member of the Russell Society for many years. Following his passing away in January 2017, and in line with his wishes, his mineral collection is now being sold to raise funds for his chosen good cause, the Kent and Sussex Hospital League of Friends.

Norman's collection contains a wide range of foreign and British species, with an emphasis on the chemistry of minerals rather than aesthetics. The collection is well curated, with specimens in a clean condition and supported by labels, a card index system and catalogues. The collection is housed in a number of cabinets that are included as an integral part of the sale. Potential purchasers should be aware that the collection contains a number of radioactive minerals.
