

### **TREVOR BRIDGES TROPHY**

Trevor Bridges (1935-2015) was a prominent member of the Society for some forty years and was well-known both as a collector and as a speaker at Society meetings. He published numerous scientific papers, many of which focused on supergene mineralogy, particularly concerning Northern England, the field in which he carved out a niche for himself. He had a particular fascination with barium mineralisation and brought his expertise in stability field diagrams to bear on helping to interpret the complex geochemistry of the lead oxychloride assemblages in the Mendips.

The award, established in Trevor's memory was first awarded at the AGM in Durham in 2016. It is presented to the winner of a competition to present a favourite specimen collected during the previous 12 months on a Russell Society field trip. The specimen is to be labelled, and the reasons stated why the entrant has chosen it explained. The total area of the specimen and label shall not exceed A4 page size.

The entries will be judged by the Society President and the trophy presented to the winner at the end of the Annual Society Meeting.
